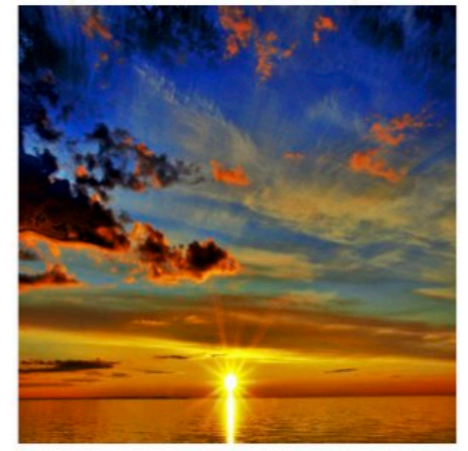

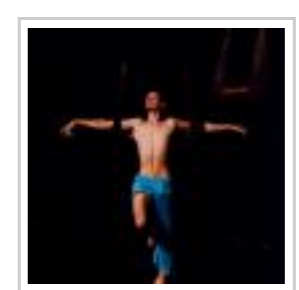

In recognition of the 2015 International Year of Light, [The Waimea Consort](#) will present a concert focused on the many forms of light; natural, reflected, metaphorical, and spiritual light are explored in songs about love, fire, sunrise, sunset, and the divine.

About the [2015 International Year of Light](#):

“ On December 23, 2013, The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 2015 as the International Year of Light and Light-based Technologies (IYL2015). Championed by scientific organizations around the world, IYL2015 will promote improved public and political understanding of the central role of light in the modern world and celebrate significant scientific anniversaries occurring in 2015.

The Waimea Consort's concert will include pieces by early music composers Thomas Tallis, Thomas Morley, and Tomás Luis de Victoria. Contemporary works include compositions by Morten Lauridsen, Guy Forbes, and Eric Whitacre.

Two members of the Waimea Consort teach at UH Hilo: alto [Patricia Perez](#), a lecturer in linguistics, and soprano [Amy Gregg](#), an instructor and advisor in the gender and women's studies program.

It's been over 10 years since the group performed in Hilo.

“Since Amy and I teach here, we thought we'd try giving a concert in a classroom,” says Perez, who serves as the group's president. “I'm excited to be singing here and I hope this will be the beginning of a new chapter in the consort's history: regular concerts in Hilo.”

Gregg says, “I'm new to the group, but it definitely means a lot to me to be singing in Hilo and on campus.”

The group also will perform on Sunday, Dec. 6, 2015, 4:00 p.m., at the Davies Chapel, Hawai'i Preparatory Academy, in Waimea.

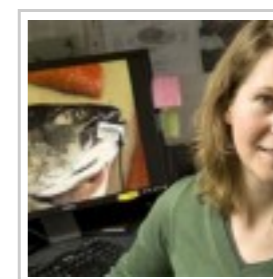
